

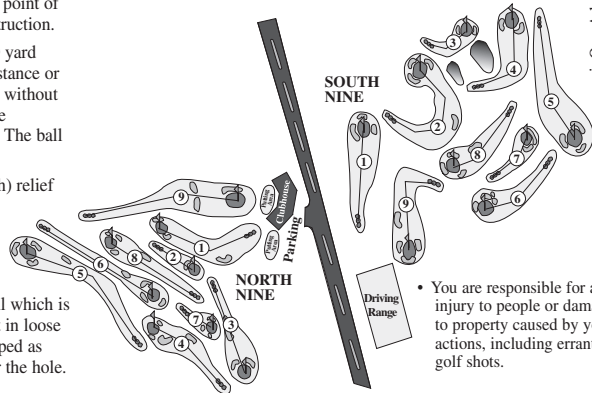

LOCAL RULES

USGA Rules shall govern all play except for the following.

1. **IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS:** If cart paths, protective fences, pipes, ropes, lateral stakes, guy wires, wooden steps, flower beds, french drains (gravel), distance markers or hole signs that interfere with a player's stance or swing, the ball may be dropped in accordance with the "OBSTRUCTION RULE" (24-2). NOTE: The player must determine the nearest point of relief without crossing over, through or under the obstruction.
2. **Protection of young trees identified by stakes and 150 yard small bushes:** If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(1) (Immovable Obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted. (Rule 33-8)
3. For a ball hit into the water hazards on Hole #3 (South) relief may be taken at the "drop area." One stroke penalty.
4. White chalk lines or protective fences denote ground under repair. The ball may be dropped in accordance with "Ground Under Repair" Rule 25-1
5. **Embedded Balls:** Anywhere "through the green" a ball which is embedded in its own pitch mark in the ground, except in loose sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. (Rule 20).

6. Anywhere "through the green" conditions that result from the unintentional land shifting, such as cracks, fissures, fault lines and embankments, shall be deemed "Ground Under Repair." Player may proceed under Rule 25-1.
7. Stones in Bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies)
8. **Bridges that Cross Hazards:** The bridges that cross the hazards are declared an "integral part of the course" therefore no free relief may be taken if the bridges interfere with a players swing or stance.
