

Hole #1 - Burn - The 1st and 18th holes at The Tribute Golf Club are in tribute to the 1st and 18th holes of the Old Course at St. Andrews, widely considered the birthplace of the game. The two holes share a fairway, making for the widest fairway in golf.

Hole #2 - Brae - A tribute to the 5th hole of the Championship Course at Carnoustie, this par 4 is emblematic of that course's unique design style. Carnoustie may well be the most challenging golf course in the world.

Hole #3 - Long - This hole is styled after the 6th hole of the Championship Course at Carnoustie, where Ben Hogan won the 1953 Open. Carnoustie's 6th hole played a key role as Hogan chose the riskier play to the left of the bunkers leading to two birdies in the 36 hole final round. The "alley" left of the fairway bunkers is now aptly named "Hogan's Alley."

Hole #4 - Achinchanter - In tribute to the 4th hole of the Championship Course at Royal Dornoch in northern Scotland, this hole's plateau green is one of the best examples of a "Dornoch Green."



Hole #5 - Postage Stamp - This tribute to the 8th hole at Royal Troon features a narrow, tough-to-hit green. Royal Troon's Postage Stamp is one of the shortest par 3 holes ever to be used for Major Championship golf.

Hole #6 - Battery - This hole is a tribute to the 1st hole at Machrihanish, located near Campbeltown on the Kintyre Peninsula of Scotland. Presumably the original "Cape" hole in golf, it is typified by a tee shot which allows the player to bite off as much of the "trouble," on the interior of the hole, as he feels confident in trying.

Hole #7 - Fin Me Oot - This hole is styled after the 5th hole of the Ailsa Course at Turnberry, one of the most dramatic and difficult par 4s on that great course.

Hole #8 - Coulart - The 8th hole is in tribute to the 4th hole of the Old Course at Moray Golf Club, one of the most interesting par 3s in Scotland.

Hole #9 - Muirfield - This hole is a tribute to the 9th hole at Muirfield, which is one of the most strategically designed par 5s in the world.

Hole #10 - Eglington - In tribute to the 9th hole at Prestwick, this hole is an immensely challenging par 4 with a green that runs away from the fairway. The original Prestwick course, laid out by Old Tom Morris, hosted the first Open Championship.

Hole #11 - High - The 11th hole is in tribute to the 11th hole at St. Andrews, one of the best par 3s in all of golf. It was on the 11th in the Open Championship of 1921 that Bobby Jones picked up his ball and withdrew in disgust and disdain of the course. He eventually grew to learn and love St. Andrews, winning the Open Championship there in 1927.

Hole #12 - Wall - This very imaginative par 5 is a tribute to the 12th hole at Prestwick, one of the three original great courses in golf. Prestwick's impact on golf architecture that followed was immense.

Hole #13 - Sutors - This hole is styled after the 15th hole at the Nairn Golf Club, a northern Scotland course which hosted the Walker Cup Matches of 1999.

Hole #14 - Tripp's Favorite - The 14th hole is in tribute to the 13th hole at Muirfield, where the first Open Championship to be contested over 72 holes was played in 1892.

Hole #15 - Whins - This hole is a tribute to the 14th hole at Western Gales, a true links course originally opened in 1898. *Golf Magazine* recently included this hole as one of the best 500 holes in the world.

Hole #16 - Wee Burn - The 16th hole is styled after the 16th hole of the Ailsa Course at Turnberry, one of the best finishing stretch holes in golf. One of the most beautiful courses in the world, the Ailsa Course was the site of Tom Watson's and Jack Nicklaus' epic battle in the 1977 Open.

Hole #17 - Road hole - The 17th hole is in tribute to the 17th hole of the Old Course at St. Andrews, considered today as the most unique and interesting courses in the world.

Hole #18 - Tom Morris - This spectacular finishing hole is a tribute to the 18th hole of the Old Course at St. Andrews, which has served as the conclusion of more Open Championships than any other. This relatively simple hole features a large sloping green and the "Valley of Sin" found on the front of the green as its only real defenses.
